Here is a tip from the *Frugal Artist Newsletter* published by Karen Alexander, one of our members. It is a solution for storing paper and works to beat the humidity and the bugs.

Longs Drugs sells Ziploc bags, called BIG BAGS. XX large is 24 inches by 32 inches. X large size is 24 inches by 20 inches. The bottoms have a pleat that gives you up to 7 inches in depth. They are waterproof, airtight, see-through, bug proof, and easy to store. Thank you Karen.
